

Project Ireland 2040

- National Planning Framework and National Development Plan
- Aligned, Long-Term Frameworks
- Aim is sustainable growth and to change development patterns over time



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National Growth Drivers to 2040



- Around 1 million additional people
- 660,000 additional jobs, 550,000 extra homes
- High but falling birth rate, ageing population, sustained net in-migration
- €116 Billion Capital Investment in NDP

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Critical Influences



- 'Business as Usual' vs Alternatives
- Regional & Local Ambition
- The locational choice of firms and individuals talent & enterprise
- Investment linked to better planning

Strategic planning draws these issues together

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NPF 'Core' Strategy

- '50:50' growth target between (a) Eastern & Midlands and (b) Southern and Northern and Western Regions
- At least 50% growth target for 5 cities; 5 regional/cross-border 'leads'
- 50% brownfield/infill development target for cities, 30% elsewhere, 40% overall
- Package of measures for investment in/planning for rural regeneration
- Planning and investment working together = Strategy




NDP/NPF National Strategic Outcomes

- 1) Compact Growth
- 2) Enhanced Regional Accessibility
- 3) Strengthened Rural Economies and Communities
- 4) Sustainable Mobility
- 5) A Strong Economy, supported by Enterprise, Innovation and Skills
- 6) High-Quality International Connectivity
- 7) Enhanced Amenity and Heritage
- 8) Transition to a Low-Carbon and Climate-Resilient Society
- 9) Sustainable Management of Water and other Environmental Resources
- 10) Access to Quality Childcare, Education and Health Services

NDP-NPF Implementation

• Co-ordination/Delivery:

Ireland 2040 Project Board - NDP-NPF steering and integration across Government

Programme Management:

- Monitoring, reporting and review; Capital Projects Tracker Funds will be part of this
- Planning System/Governance:
 - Regional Spatial and Economic Strategies (RSESs), Metropolitan Area Strategic Plans (MASPs); Local Authority Plans and new/updated Guidance; Planning Regulator

• Four New Funds:

- Regeneration and Development Funds Co-ordinated operation of €2bn urban/€1bn rural funds
- National Land Development Agency: established in September

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4 x NDP Funds – "Smart money"

- Government has approved four funds to support PI2040/NPF objectives
- €4bn over 10 years additional to core funding streams ... intended as transformational place-making initiatives with considerable scope for match funding and leveraging ... added value!
- DHPLG to manage Urban Regeneration and Development Fund (URDF) €2bn to 2027, which will be similar in approach to...
- Rural Regeneration and Development Fund €1bn to 2027, managed by the Department for Rural and Community Development
- 2 further funds on disruptive technologies (DBEI) and climate change (DCCAE)

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Role of Land Development Agency

Ensure the optimal usage of State land, with the following key strategic objectives:

- 1. To coordinate appropriate State lands for regeneration and development
 - Open up key sites not being optimally used, especially for new home delivery
 - Focus on the overall public interest in determining land use
- 2. To drive **strategic land assembly** for the long term by introducing **new mechanisms** for working with both public and private sector land owners
 - Stabilise land values, flattening extreme peaks and troughs
 - Drive increased affordability through better land availability

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Key Next Steps

- Embedding national monitoring of outcomes ... regular reviews/policy updates
- Regional Plans working with Regional Assemblies and Local Govt sector to ensure effective Regional Strategies and Metropolitan Plans that operationalise the NPF
- Aligning Departments/Agencies policies and priorities co-ordinated, joined-up delivery
- Transformational place-making at all levels region, city/urban, rural, community
- Mobilising Land Development Agency to act strategically regeneration opportunities
