



What is Small Business Innovation Research?

SBIR drives innovation in the public sector, and in companies, as they co-design solutions with the Challenge Owner* to address significant societal challenges that impact citizens

Key Features of SBIR

- A global Pre Commercial Procurement initiative
- Is there a new way of solving traditional problems?
- Enables public sector address 'unmet needs' through innovation
- Public sector body defines the Challenge & SMEs respond with innovative solutions
- Leads to cheaper, smarter, more 'fit for purpose' solutions
- SBIR is competitive in nature with a two phased approach
- Awarded companies win a development contract & co-design an innovative solution with the Challenge Owners to address defined problems
- Companies retain the IP developed
- El currently contributes 50% of funding per challenge, matched by Challenge Owner
- Solves societal Challenges, fosters innovation within the public sector, stimulates economic development

SBIR Ireland: Where are we now?

Progress

To date 2 competitive calls to the public sector have been launched by SBIR Ireland;

- EI has approved 20 SBIR Challenges to date, worth €1.25 million (co-funded by Challenge Owners)
- 70 Phase 1 contracts and 30 Phase 2 contracts have been awarded to date.
- A variety of themes including illegal dumping, diabetes prevention, flood monitoring and access to rural transport

SBIR Ireland Challenge Examples



Office of Public Works - Creating a 'Virtual Historic Dublin'

- How can we create a 'living history' of Dublin City
- Innovative companies creating augmented reality solutions in Dublin Castle



Dublin City Council - How can we prevent flooding in the city?

- Sensors deployed across the city monitoring flood levels
- Empowering gully engineers with data: can identify the problem spots quicker



Limerick Council - How can we entice people to live in Limerick City?

- Georgian buildings have high inoccupancy rates
- Fire safety is an issue companies developing solutions that can monitor hazards

Can SBIR help your public sector organisation?

- ✓ Is there potential to benefit citizens?
- Do you have an 'unmet need' i.e. a challenge that you haven't been able to solve to date through standard procurement? Or perhaps a solution doesn't yet exist to solve your challenge
- ✓ Is this an urgent challenge is it a priority for the Challenge Owner?
- ✓ Is there a champion(s) within your organisation that is willing to lead this challenge, and do they have support and resources to drive the Challenge forward?
- ✓ What is the potential for innovative technology to solve the problem identified?
- ✓ Is there a scope for broader market potential for the awarded suppliers?
- Can the investment deliver appropriate return to you and the suppliers involved?

New SBIR Ireland Call!

- Our third competitive call to the public sector
- 3-5 new SBIR challenges will be approved
- The call will not be sector / theme specific
- Applications can be from one organisation or multiple organisations, but must have a lead applicant
- Applicants must provide a commitment to a minimum of €100K funding over the course of the Challenge life if approved
- Call will be open from 14th October to 4th December
- How can we encourage teams to consider SBIR tool as a new way to solve their problems in innovative ways?
